Animals Large animals can become dangerous. Cattle can knock down and trample a child without noticing that they are there. A calm animal can become dangerous if it or its offspring feel threatened. Children should have adult supervision when around large animals.

Water Ponds, lakes and other areas of water can be hazardous to young children. If not properly supervised, children can be injured or drown. Children should have adult supervision in and around water.

Tractors Large farm equipment can be loud and damaging to hearing if proper noise protection is not worn. Tractors are very large and loud, and drivers may not be able to see or hear children in the area. Children should play in a safe area away from any parked or moving equipment.

Grain Trailers Children should never play around or in any farm equipment. Grain trailers can especially be dangerous as they can lead to grain entrapment.

Motorbikes and Quad Bikes Motorbikes can be dangerous if children do not have the proper training or protection when using. Children should be properly trained, have proper sized machines, protection (helmet, long pants, long sleeves), and adult supervision while operating the bike. Only let people with the right training and experience ride a quad bike. Bike riders must have appropriate riding skills. To check a rider's skills, talk about safe farm bike riding with them and get them to show their skills under direct supervision. Riders must know about the best routes to take, no-go zones and what jobs can be done by bike compared to other vehicles.

Chemicals and Fuel Farm chemicals, animal health products and fuel can be dangerous to children if they are not properly stored. Chemicals should be stored in a safe location away from children with original containers and labels.

Farm Buildings Falls from farm machinery and buildings can lead to serious injuries. Children should not play in farm buildings or be left unsupervised in them.

Sun Unprotected exposure to ultra-violet (UV) rays can be dangerous for people of all ages. Children should wear proper protection while playing outside in the sun.
